## **March Mingle Seminar Descriptions**

# PANEL DISCUSSION: Supplying Trophy Ranches- Chase Jones, Broadmouth Canyon Ranch and Greg Golightly, White Peaks Ranch, Moderated by Bill Mayes.

This session features a panel discussion to provide insight into the needs of trophy ranches. What bull sizes are in the hottest demand? When do trophy ranches prefer arrangements to be made for the incoming season? Any tips for breeders? Examples provided by the panelists are intended to develop stronger working relationships between the breeding and hunting sides of the industry and NAEBA membership. Bring your questions!

### SEMINAR: Elk CWD Live Testing- Dr. Davin Henderson, CWD Evolution.

What is the status of live CWD testing for elk? In this session, leading Chronic Wasting Disease researcher Dr. Davin Henderson shares updates on the use of live CWD testing and its benefits. This coincides with NAEBA's Elk Research Foundation work on how this test can be used to limit industry hardship in the unlikely chance a herd is impacted by Chronic Wasting Disease or a trace out. #### SEMINAR: Reducing Unnecessary Regulations- Travis Lowe, NAEBA Executive Director.
