SEMINAR DESCRIPTIONS

SEMINAR: Interactive Hard Antler Scoring Stations.

Every year NAEBA's Convention offers the Hard Antler Measuring Seminar designed to demonstrate the scoring procedure in a classroom setting. In order to give attendees a hands-on experience, this seminar features several scoring stations having antler sets for small groups to work with a hard antler judge. Attendees will get to examine different antler sets and talk through where to make marks and other critical decisions. Whether you are new or experienced in scoring antler, this is a great way to build and/or brush up on your scoring skills.

ROUNDTABLE DISCUSSION: The Future of the Velvet Antler Industry.

This seminar will feature discussion about the future of the velvet antler industry, assessing the pros and cons of velveting bulls versus not velveting bulls, potential income differentials and hearing from other ranchers their determining factors to harvest antler in velvet or after fully grown.

SEMINAR: Farm Promotion and Ways to Educate the Public – Deb Anderson, Anderson Elk Ranch.

Elk ranching comes in many different models but, in general, its practice and benefits are little known by the public. It is an advantage for the elk industry when ranches proactively work to educate the public. This seminar features Deb Anderson, who shares their ranch promotion ideas based on decades of experience. SEMINAR: Elk Meat Industry Update - Rick Ewert, Meat Industry Committee Chairman.

Elk meat table fare has a large fan base but how does it get there? What are the rules for elk meat to enter the market that producers should know about? This seminar features the chairman of NAEBA Meat Industry Committee covering lots of the basics from differences between state and federal inspections, labeling, processing plants and more!

SEMINAR: Effectively Communicating with Your State Regulator

– Dr. Maggie Baldwin, Colorado Department of Agriculture.

Colorado is known to be one of the better places to own elk, in part because of its reputation for common sense regulators. The local industry and NAEBA have learned tremendously from the Colorado Department of Agriculture on how to effectively work to improve the regulatory environment. This seminar leads a discussion of how the elk industry can use those lessons and apply them to each state to strike the balance between rules based off science while allowing ranches to thrive. Improved rules only come with effective advocacy work!

SEMINAR: Emerging Technology of Animal ID - Tod Adams, AllFlex.

One thing all elk ranchers have in common, regardless of the operational type or location, is the requirement to use animal identification. An emerging trend, however, is how animal identification technology has evolved and how that may provide new advantages to the owner. Many ranchers are using such technology on the ranch while other state agencies are recommending their use too. This seminar aims to explain what's new in this world and its opportunity.
